AMBROSE. 72 DINKINS, III.,CHAPLIN Dunnellon - Chaplin Ambrose Dinkins, III, age 72 of Dunnellon, died Thursday, October 14, 2010. Mr. Dinkins was born and raised in Dunnellon on December 14, 1937 to the late Chaplin Ambrose Dinkins, Jr. and Virginia Elizabeth (Byerly) Dinkins. He was the owner and operator of Dinkins Service Store in Dunnellon and served our Country in the U.S. Army Reserves. Mr. Dinkins was an active member of the First United Methodist Church of Dunnellon where he served as Church Treasurer for 26 years and Sunday School Superintendent.
