TORNADO & FMSA

Following the recent tornadoes that tore through Tuscaloosa, Ron Wiborg '66 was finally able to contact Robert Hart '66 who lives in Tuscaloosa. The following is the email Robert sent to Ron...in its entirety, in answer to inquiries made about his welfare. It does give quite a perspective of the devastation.

"Dear friends,

Pardon the generic nature of this note. but this is the first chance I have had to respond to the many attempts, on your part, to communicate with us. Our power just came back on and then the Internet service today. Thanks for the inquiries of concern...phone been almost service has nonexistent but today that is getting better also... thank you for the calls...an update...I have been through two big hurricanes..but have never been in this kind of destruction...what I have seen today, on TV, that ya'll have been seeing regarding this event is 5% of the story...my family, home, office, vehicles are fine...our side of the river was untouched...it is a beautiful spring day here...across the river it looks

like sections have been carpet bombed...2 miles away a elementary school is gone...all garbage trucks destroyed....it missed a packed regional hospital by 200 yards...the University is untouched...not a tree down...a friend in an affluent area found three black kids dead in her back yard...with no idea of where they were carried from..or to whom they belong...the horror stories will fill a book someday...it's Hollywood stuff...a policeman yesterday was directing me to some condos we own...I inquired about him and he broke down telling me the cadaver dogs had just been brought in to his area...some looting is going on..8pm to 6:30 am curfew is in effect..many government offices have relocated to Bryant-Denny football stadium on campus...most all of the student athletes and all of the football team were out serving the next day...Coach Saben was driving around in his pickup giving out water and hugs..it is just heartbreaking...I tried to tell Babs about it...she was in B'ham when it hit here...but when I took her out yesterday for her to actually see the area she was blowing away by the utter devastation...at times she couldn't figure where she was because so much is gone. Those of you who know Tusc...one can stand on the corner of 15th and McFarland and see Bryant -Denny and the Coliseum...because so much is gone between the two locations..two schools have power the rest do not...two schools...gone! The Bama kids have been sent home being told they can keep the grade they have now or contact their professor for a final sometime in the future...Our prayer is that our sovereign God will honor Himself in this...giving us words that heal, compassion that is real and a sensitivity to the Holy Spirit on where to serve (one feels like there is so much to do..in every direction...so much incredible need where do you start that will actually make a difference) and whom to pray for and share the Gospel with...Babs and I were to be at a social event in NC (Ashville) area for a week leaving tomorrow..its paid for and yet we just don't have peace about going...if you want to send money to help folks here are some suggestions ...we are buying a bunch of \$ 25.00 cards from Wal-Mart, etc, to give out to the most needy..you can send \$ to us and we will put it with ours.(no deduction)..or the Salvation Army (their new building is gone)..or the Red Cross or go one line and get the address for Church of the Highlands (and get a deduction) designate for Tusc., because B'ham, Cullman and a 100 little towns or spots in the road, etc. have been hammered as well...please pray for our area...for restoration...physical, emotional and spiritual healing...wisdom for our officials and an open door for us to make a difference...in Jesus name...
